Spotlight On ...

Karate

During the last two weeks, students have spent part of their summer studying the art of Goju-Ryu Karate. The phrase, Go, is the Japanese word for hardness and Ju is the word for 'softness' or 'gentleness'. The phase, Ryu, means way of. The proper translation of Goju-Ryu means the way of the hard and soft. The system is based on an Oriental concept that all hardness and stiffness is not good. At the same time all softness and too much gentleness is not good. The two should complement each other. Combining the two gives Goju-Ryu karate beautiful movement, filled with grace, flowing forms and strength.

Actions are sometimes extremely fast and other times slow and majestic. The existence of both hard and soft techniques in this system is characteristic of Goju-Ryu karate. Learning how to defend oneself and others is not the primary goal in Goju-Ryu karate. A great emphasis is placed on respect for others, humility, confidence, responsibility, honesty, perseverance, and honor.

The physical and mental challenges that take place during their sessions help our students handle conflicts that take place in the outside world. In short, the physical and mental aspects of Goju-Ryu karate will only enhance the character of our students.
